



Nourished by the Sacraments

A Reflection on the Fifth Sunday of Easter By Jerome J. Sabatowich

Some groups have secret handshakes to distinguish members from non-members and other groups have emblems or distinctive uniforms. The followers of Jesus also have something to set them apart from the crowd, their love for each other. Today's Gospel reading ends with Jesus telling the apostles that their love for one another will be the way other people know they are his disciples. Love is supposed to be what separates them from those who do not believe in Jesus.

A problem arises because the English language uses the one word, love, to describe a wide variety of experiences. We sometimes think of love as a feeling, but we can also use this word to describe many different types of relationships (i.e., the relationship between a parent and child, the relationship between two friends, or the relationship between a husband and a wife). This little four-letter word can have several different definitions depending on the context within which we use it. With so many possible meanings, how can we know for certain what Jesus had in mid when he spoke the words in today's Gospel?

Although Jesus did not speak English, he may have know three different languages: Hebrew (the official language of the Jewish people), Aramaic (the everyday language of the people of Palestine), and Greek (the language of the Roman empire). Of these three languages, Greek will be the most helpful in determining the type of love Jesus was talking about.

There are several different Greek words for our one word "love', including philia, a love that describes a love between two friends: eros, sexual love; and agape, a self-giving love. Of these three different words for love, agape is the one we most frequently find on the lips of Jesus. It is also the word of love in today's Gospel.

Agape is the love that focuses on the needs of the other person. It is freely given without counting the cost and without thinking of getting anything in return. Agape looks beyond physical beauty, color of skin, political beliefs and status. It means reaching out to all people even if they are repulsive or if society considers them worthless. It is the love that should be the hallmark of every Christian.

For Reflection

"See how they love each other!" was the way the non-Christians described the early followers of Jesus. Would non-Christians today say that about your parish community?


