

# Nourished by the Sacraments

#### A Reflection on the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time From Fr. Eric Asamoah

In the Gospel, a scribe asked Jesus a very basic religious question: "What should I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus responds by directing the scribe's attention to the Sacred Scriptures and emphasizing the importance of loving God and expressing it by loving one's neighbor.

However, to the scribe, the word "neighbor" meant another scribe or Pharisee and never a Samaritan or a Gentile. Jesus, therefore, used the parable of the Good Samaritan to illustrate the most important quality he wants in his followers. It is in answering the specific question: "Who is my neighbor?" A "neighbor" is anyone who needs help. And in fact, everyone without exception must be treated with love and respect. A good neighbor does not say, "I do what I want to do," or even, "I do what I have to do," but "I do what I ought to do." The scribe's question, "Who is my neighbor?" reveals that he was self-centered.

In the second reading, St. Paul reminds the Colossians, and us, that just as Christ Jesus is the "visible image of the invisible God," so our neighbors are the visible image of Christ living in our midst. Jesus, the Heavenly Good Samaritan, gave us a final commandment during the Last Supper, "Love one another as I have loved you," because the invisible God dwells in every human being, our neighbor.

It is well to remember that Deuteronomy's law of love in the first reading was given while the Israelites were on their journey to the Promised Land, and that the Gospel parables were told while the disciples were still on their way to Jerusalem. Perfect charity is a challenge all through life. Along that journey there can be stops and even wrong turnings, but if we remember the Good Samaritan story, we can renew our desire to follow his example of love.

The Samaritan shows the virtues of humanity, even in people of whom a little good was expected. The Jews were meant to take special care of the stranger, the widow, and the orphan. These were the groups most in need of charity, and so whoever came to help them would be helpful to all, without exception. The parable makes us realize that every human person is our neighbor.

How have we been good neighbors this week? Here at St Mark, the Samaritan ministry among many other volunteering ministries offers faithful volunteers another way to express God's love to our neighbors. Consider helping as a volunteer in any way possible. God bless you all.




