

# Nourished by the Sacraments



A Reflection on the Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time From Deacon John Kren Lk 13: 22-30

LK 13. 22-30

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough."

My first thought is about an electronics store on Black Friday. Everyone waiting patiently but as the time gets closer, the hour nears, the minutes tick down the pushing and the shoving. It is the usual door.

The gate appears to become narrower and narrower as more people try to squeeze through it, without cooperation, without the help of others. Strive to enter through the narrow gate. And sometimes it is "striving" because we can't get through without the work, the help, the participation of others.

Is the gate narrow or is the mob, the traffic too tangled? Our gate to salvation is open to us, and to all. St. Luke and his community struggle with the reality of who is in and who is out. Who is first or last, last or first, the message of Jesus is simple: get in.

And who is going through with us? Who will help us? Who must we help? Jesus invites everyone to enter --- the poor, hungry, homeless, immigrant, foreigner, perplexed, wealthy, ragged, elderly, unborn, children, parents, teachers, students, grasping, wandering, begging, everything, everyone. That is who is here today, to our right and left, trying to cram through the gate.

What a crowd, indeed. Come in ...everyone. No need to push or shove. Cooperate, help each other out like being catechist, sponsors, giving blood. Everyone with fear of God and faith approach---have strength. Once through the gate, breathe a sigh of relief for there is plenty of space, grace for all, the beatific vision of God forever.


It's a beautiful vision, but of course, we like to put conditions on who goes in front of us. We like to pick and choose, among one another, and even within ourselves who or what is capable, is justified, is worthy of being in front of us in this tunnel.

They are just like us except for God's grace and yet God is calling them just as he is calling us, perhaps calling them as much or even more than he is calling us.

Calling us over the noise of our own pride, our feeling of self-importance, masking our weaknesses, harboring the death of our sins. Calling us out of our weakness, God is calling us. Through our weakness, because of our weakness, calling us through the stumbles and fender-benders of life, of tormented days through which grace still rushes through. God is calling us. He is calling us.


No matter who we are, no matter how far we have come or need to come, we know from reading the epistle to the Hebrews we are being treated as sons, children of God. For what "son" is there whom his father does not discipline? All discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later this chastisement brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it.

Are we willing to be trained, are we willing to pass through the narrow gates of this world, are we willing to enter the door with others. Are we willing to face ourselves? Are we willing to gain heaven? -- Are we willing to be saved?






